

Why this session?

It's always important to learn as much as you can about your host country before you go abroad in order to have a positive, successful experience. For LGBTQ+ students, this includes understanding the country's laws and culture toward sexual identity.

- Some countries may require you to modify your behaviors or self expression while abroad.
- You will need to determine in advance how comfortable you feel adjusting your own
- behaviors to suit the cultural norms of a given culture and select a destination
- accordingly.
- Depending on where you go, you may be redefining what a student from an American
- university is for our international counterparts; therefore, it is wise to prepare yourself
- for cultural and societal differences.







Tips

Always put your safety first. Before you leave, familiarize yourself with the customs and laws of your host country.

Research the terms and definitions used in your host country to talk about LGBTQ+ issues and identities.

Build a support network of family, friends, GEO program administrators, and other study abroad students who you can rely on while abroad.

Questions to Ask

How are people with my identities perceived in my host country? What kind of stereotypes are there?

How should I react if I find something to be offensive? Is the person curious or do they have bad intentions?

Has my host family housed LGBTQ+ students before? If not, will this be a problem?

Am I used to being part of the majority at home but will be a minority abroad? Or vice versa? Who should I contact if I do face homophobic or transphobic incidents?

Does my program have support staff that will understand and help me through any discriminatory incident I may face?

Unfortunately no place is perfectly free of ignorance, homophobia, transphobia, or other forms of discrimination. Just like at home in the U.S., you may find various levels of acceptance by some people and discrimination by others while abroad. Be aware that these problems do exist in various degrees in other countries, but this should not prevent you from traveling.

Trans and Non-binary Friendly Program Highlights: Internships

- Build Your Own Internship: Summer, Semester, Spring Break, or Winter Break
 - You find your own internship and housing. You work with GEO for credits.
 - Possible around the world
 - Flexible and based on your interests
- Internships in Buenos Aires, Argentina: Summer or Semester
 - 3 housing options: homestay, shared apartment (flexible), or
 - independent housing
 - Argentina legally recognizes non-binary gender on all official
 - documentation
- B rating for LGTBQ friendliness(same as US), 26th in the world
 - Very thoughtful and intentional Global Partner, Road2Argentina

Trans and Non-binary Friendly Program Highlights: Exchange and Gateway Programs

- Free University of Amsterdam (Amsterdam, Netherlands): Semester
 - Ranked #3 in the world for LGTBQ friendliness, A rating
 - Has dedicated office and resources for LGBTQ pride including events, workshops – see VU Pride website.
 - Independent housing
- Veritas University (San Jose, Costa Rica): Gateway and Exchange semester
 - Progressive country in a traditionally conservative region.
 - Veritas works with host family network to find the best fit for
 - individual students, including gender identities
 - 41st in the world in for LGTBQ friendliness, C+ rating

Trans and Non-binary Friendly Program Highlights: Faculty Led

- Switzerland International Security Studies: Mason-Led, Summer &
 Switzerland/France The Future of the United Nations and the European
 Union: Winter
 - Switzerland: B+ LGBTQ friendliness rating (#12), France: A- rating (#10)
- Supportive transgender legal identity laws
- Partner is able to provide individual housing as space is available
- Spanish Language in Granada (Granada, Spain): Summer
 - Spain has supportive transgender legal identity laws and an A-LGBTQ friendliness rating (#9)
 - Program housing is in homestays


