- 7. The right to have opinions, feelings, and needs be given respect and consideration.
- 8. The right to refuse requests without guilt
- 9. The right to expect one's roommate will not violate the current Housing Terms and Conditions
- 10. The right to discuss any and all disagreements when a suitemate or staff member finds it necessary.
- 11. The right to expect that any and all disagreements will be discussed in an atmosphere of openness and mutual respect, and that it is acceptable to confront one's roommate when the roommate is not fulfilling mutual agreement
